

Procedure Date CRF

Please note it is important to enter the Procedure Date CRF into the database as soon as the last cryoablation procedure has been performed on the enrolled index tumor(s). This form sets the follow-up visit windows dates at the top scheduled visit table in the database. It has been noted that if the Month 1 Follow-up CRF is entered <u>before</u> the Procedure Date CRF, the visit may incorrectly appear out of window as indicated by the icon in the table. If this occurs, it can be corrected by re-saving the form after the Procedure Date CRF is entered.

Retreatment Follow-up

Subjects who receive additional Galil Medical cryoablation to an index tumor continue to be followed. The retreated tumor begins on a new follow-up schedule. If for some reason, the tumor undergoes imaging out of window, on the Deviation CRF, please choose "Other, specify" on the visit interval and in the text field below, type in "# month re-treatment visit, tumor #R".

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
